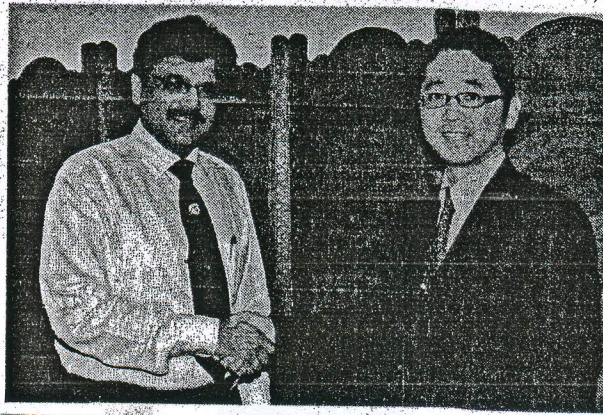

Japan govt organisation NEDO (New Energy and Industrial Technology Development Organisation), under Ministry of Economy Trade & Industry Japan, has initiated discussions with BSNL to reduce the carbon print created by pollution from diesel generating sets used at the telecom towers.
